Faith is not simply believing that God exists; it is trusting that His mercy reaches us where we are. In this week's readings, St Paul reminds us that Abraham trusted God's promise even when hope seemed impossible. That same faith is reflected in the Gospel, where those who came to Jesus did so believing that He could heal, restore, and forgive.

Jesus calls Matthew the tax collector not because he is perfect, but because he is willing to respond. He welcomes the sick, the sinner, and the outcast, showing that God's love is offered freely to all who seek Him. We also witness the faith of a synagogue leader and a woman who quietly reaches out to Jesus in hope. Their trust brings healing and new life.

These readings invite us to place our confidence not in ourselves, but in the mercy and power of Christ. Wherever we find ourselves this week, may we hear His call, reach out in faith, and discover again the life He longs to give.
