Focussing on the first week of this double issue the readings invite us to live with hope and patience. In St Paul's Letter to the Romans (8:12–25), we are reminded that, as children of God, we are called to live by the Spirit. Although we experience suffering and uncertainty, we do not lose heart, for God's promise of new life is already at work within us. We wait in hope for the fullness of what God has prepared.

In the Gospel, (Matthew 13: 24-30 & 36-43) Jesus explains the parable of the wheat and the weeds. Good and evil often grow side by side in our world and even within our own hearts. Rather than demanding immediate judgement, God shows extraordinary patience, allowing time for repentance, growth, and transformation.

Together, these readings encourage us to trust God's wisdom rather than our own impatience. As we nurture the good that God has planted in us through prayer, kindness, and faithful living, we become signs of hope in a world longing for healing. May we continue to live as God's beloved children, confident that, in the end, his goodness and justice will prevail.

Parish Giving Scheme

We are pleased to announce that our Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) is now active. The PGS is a secure and simplified method of giving to the church, improving cash flow, reducing administrative tasks, and allowing flexibility for donors. All current forms of giving also remain.

Donations are directed to our Parish via the scheme with Gift Aid claimed on a regular rather than annual basis. Donors can make regular or one-off contributions and choose whether to opt into yearly inflation-based increases. The scheme is provided free of charge via the Diocese, and the Parish will receive 100% of any donation.

Prisoner of Conscience: Haile Naizghe has been in prison in Eritrea since May 2004 and is being held incommunicado, with no release date set. Before his arrest he was chair of a network of house churches that was banned by the government. Although held incommunicado recent reports indicate that Haile is in good health.
