In this Sunday's readings, we encounter two profound truths about the human heart. St. Paul candidly speaks of the inner struggle we all experience: wanting to do what is right, yet often falling short. His words remind us that we are not alone in our weaknesses and that God's grace is greater than our failings (Romans 7:15–25a).

In the Gospel, Jesus contrasts the fickleness of those who reject both John the Baptist and Himself, yet He does not respond with condemnation. Instead, He offers a beautiful invitation: “Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest” (Matthew 11:28).

As we navigate the challenges, disappointments, and demands of daily life, Christ calls us not to carry our burdens alone. He invites us to trust in His mercy, learn from His gentle heart, and find true rest in Him. May this week be an opportunity to surrender our struggles to the Lord and experience the peace that only He can give.

Parish Giving Scheme

We are pleased to announce that our Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) is now active. The PGS is a secure and simplified method of giving to the church, improving cash flow, reducing administrative tasks, and allowing flexibility for donors. All current forms of giving also remain.

Donations are directed to our Parish via the scheme with Gift Aid claimed on a regular rather than annual basis. Donors can make regular or one-off contributions and choose whether to opt into yearly inflation-based increases. The scheme is provided free of charge via the Diocese, and the Parish will receive 100% of any donation.

Prisoner of Conscience: A defence lawyer representing Pastor Sun Cong of Beijing Zion Church who has been detained in Beihai Detention Centre, Guangxi, China, since October 2025 has secured a rare concession from Chinese authorities, resulting in Pastor Sun receiving a Bible. Observers hope this development will potentially establish a legal pathway for other Christian detainees to gain access to Bibles and religious texts.
