6th September 2026 14th Sunday after Trinity

In this week's Gospel reading, Jesus speaks about what it means to live together as his people. He recognises that disagreements and difficulties will arise, but he encourages us not simply to walk away from one another. Instead, we are called to approach one another with honesty, patience, and love, seeking reconciliation rather than blame.

These words are particularly important for us as a church community. We are all different, with different experiences, opinions, and ways of seeing the world. At times, those differences may cause tension. Yet Jesus reminds us that every member of our church family matters.

Most importantly, Jesus promises that when even two or three gather in his name, he is there among them. Our Christian life is therefore not something we live alone. Christ is present when we listen to one another, forgive one another and seek to build a community where everyone feels valued and welcomed.

As we reflect on this Gospel, may we ask ourselves: **How can I help to make our church a place where reconciliation, forgiveness and love are at the heart of all that we do?**

Parish Giving Scheme

We are pleased to announce that our Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) is now active. The PGS is a secure and simplified method of giving to the church, improving cash flow, reducing administrative tasks, and allowing flexibility for donors. All current forms of giving also remain.

Donations are directed to our Parish via the scheme with Gift Aid claimed on a regular rather than annual basis. Donors can make regular or one-off contributions and choose whether to opt into yearly inflation-based increases. The scheme is provided free of charge via the Diocese, and the Parish will receive 100% of any donation.
