We are pleased to announce that our Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) is now active. The PGS is a secure and simplified method of giving to the church, improving cash flow, reducing administrative tasks, and allowing flexibility for donors. All current forms of giving also remain.

Donors can make regular or one-off contributions and choose whether to opt into yearly inflation-based increases. The scheme is provided free of charge via the Diocese, and the Parish will receive 100% of any donation.

Prisoner of Conscience:

We continue to pray for Pastor Yang Rongli, aged 70, of the Golden Lampstand Church in Shanxi Province, China. Pastor Yang and her husband have suffered severe persecution for practising their Christian faith. Their church building, paid for by their large congregation, was destroyed by the Chinese authorities in 2018.

Since we last prayed for Pastor Yang in June 2025, she has been sentenced to 15 years in prison on charges of "fraud", a charge sometimes used against pastors of unregistered churches. She is not due for release until 2036. Her husband is serving a sentence of nine years and seven months.

Pastor Yang is diabetic and in poor health. We pray for her safety, health, and strength, for her husband and for all those who suffer persecution because of their Christian faith. May God sustain them and give them hope, courage and peace.
