13th September 2026 15th Sunday after Trinity

In this week's Gospel reading, Peter asks Jesus a very human question: "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive?" Peter perhaps thinks he is being generous when he suggests seven times. Jesus' answer is far more challenging: forgiveness is not something we count or limit.

Through the parable of the unforgiving servant, Jesus reminds us just how much forgiveness we ourselves receive from God. The enormous debt that is cancelled represents the boundless mercy and grace of God towards us. Yet the servant, having been forgiven so much, is unwilling to forgive someone who owes him a far smaller amount.

Forgiveness does not mean pretending that hurt or wrongdoing does not matter. Nor does it always remove the consequences of what has happened. Rather, it means choosing not to allow resentment and anger to have the final word.

As we gather this week, may we remember the forgiveness we have received from God, and ask for the grace to extend that same mercy to others. For in learning to forgive, we discover more deeply the transforming love of Christ.

Prisoner of Conscience – Iryna Danylovyh

We continue to pray for Iryna Danylovyh, a civil activist and human rights defender who spoke out about problems within the healthcare system in Russian-occupied Crimea. Iryna was abducted by Russian security forces in April 2022 and, in December of that year, was sentenced to seven years in prison. She has since been transferred to a prison colony in Russia.

We pray especially for Iryna as her health continues to deteriorate and as she has reportedly lost her hearing without receiving the medical treatment she needs. We pray for her courage and strength, for her freedom, and for all those who work for justice and human rights. We remember that we last prayed for Iryna in 2024, and we entrust her once again to God's loving care.
