



- Prisoner of Conscience: Ana da Silva Miguel (aka Neth Nahara) arrested in August 2023 after she broadcast a Tik Tok video criticizing Angolan President Lourenco. Neth was convicted of 'Outrage against the State' and sentenced to 6 months in prison. In September 2023 her sentence was extended to 2 years. She was not granted any legal representation. Neth Nahara has now spent 12 months in prison and has been denied essential medication which led to a hospital admission.
- Victims of violence throughout the world; The situation in Gaza, Lebanon, Iran and Israel; Conflict in Sudan, Ukraine, Nigeria, Yemen, Myanmar and all areas in the world where war and conflict continues.
 We pray for all aid agencies working in these areas despite the risk to their own lives.
