- Prisoner of Conscience: Alaa Abd El- Fattah, 42, Egyptian/British software developer and political activist, has been imprisoned in Egypt since 29th September 2019. He was sentenced to 5 years imprisonment following charges of 'spreading false news'. Due for release on 29th September this year, the authorities have refused to release El-Fattah saying he will be held until January 2027. El-Fattah remains in Wadi-Al-Natrun prison near Cairo where he continues to endure harsh conditions.
- Everyone caught up in the devastation caused by hurricanes in Florida.
- Victims of violence throughout the world; The situation in Gaza, Lebanon, Iran and Israel; Conflict in Sudan, Ukraine, Nigeria, Yemen, Myanmar and all areas in the world where war and conflict continues.

Holiday Club for The Parks


for Primary Age Children on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of the Autumn Half-Term 29th, 30th and 31st October
