Dear Friends,

Writing these words this week takes on rather more significance than it may have done before.

Last Sunday we held our very first 'Open Table' meeting which was very well supported and is a great way forward in our endeavour to be welcoming and to provide a safe space for anyone who feels vulnerable or wary of church for any reason.

When we read of the lives of the faithful in New Testament times we see how it was through such meeting, sharing and listening that the church grew.

Are we prepared to show our friendship?

Do we vanish at the end of our services? Do we go for coffee?

Do we share in more than the worship? Do we stand still at the peace?

We are endeavouring to find ways to express the relationship of friendship that Jesus left us with...

'I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father.' In 15.15

As Epiphany comes to an end it is worth reflecting for a moment on what this season has meant and what has been the impact of Christ being made visible in the world. We can talk about charity and worship and discipleship but we often seem to miss out the church. These were the groups that bravely gathered to pray and worship and give — yet we can overlook this and take our church for granted. It is in our relationships our welcome and appreciation of each other that the basis for everything else grows.

In a culture of individualism and, for many, isolation and loneliness, the opportunity to gather is essential. Jesus created a group of friends and from them the faith spread. As our church apparently dwindles in number perhaps we should try and regain more of that sense of friendship, we may find ourselves ending up with more friends that we ever imagined.

Prisoner of Conscience: Leah Sharibu, 21, one of a group of 110 girls abducted from their school in Northeast Nigeria by Boko Haram, a faction of Islamic State West Africa Province, in 2018. The other girls, who were Muslim, were released fairly quickly but Leah, a Christian, was kept a prisoner. The militants have said that she will only be released if she converts to Islam, and to date she has refused to do so. The militants have said that they will hold Leah as a 'slave for life'. Her exact whereabouts are unknown.
