**Prisoner of Conscience:** Iranian Christian convert Mina Khajavi was detained in a raid on a house church in June 2020. Two years later Mina was sentenced to six years in prison for "acting against national security" through leading a house church. Following an unsuccessful appeal she began serving her sentence in January 2024. She is not due to be released until December 2029. The authorities have recently provided Mina with a bed that is suitable for her arthritis – before this she was forced to climb to an upper bunk every night. Recently-released prisoners say she has a positive attitude and high spirits.
