Healing Service - Sunday 15th February at 4 pm in Holy Trinity

Does God still heal today? What is our role in healing? What do we even mean by healing? These are some of the questions I have been exploring for my BA studies currently. In the gospels, we saw Jesus heal many people in many different ways, but of course not all people. That provokes a question. We also saw Jesus send out his disciples to “cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those with a skin disease, cast out demons.” Matthew 10:8 What does this mean for us?

Learning about healing ministry, I found this reflection helpful: “This ministry reflects Jesus’ concern and love for the whole person, which may manifest in a number of ways:

- Recovery from diseases
- A growing awareness of inner peace and wholeness
- Healing of our relationship with prolonged illness / an aspect of our life we are unhappy with
- Healing of our relationships with one another
- Healing that is so unexpected we want to call it a miracle
- Experiencing our fear of death transformed by God’s love

This has broadened my understanding and expectation of God’s healing in our lives.

As a stand-alone event, we invite you to come before God to pray specifically for our own healing or of those we know in any of the broad senses given above. Join us for this reflective service, where there will be the opportunity to be anointed with oil and to receive prayer, or just come to consider these questions about God at work through healing - **Sun 15th Feb, 4 pm Holy Trinity**

If any of you are sick, they should call for the elders of the church, and the elders should pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord’. James 5:14

Prisoner of Conscience: Christian convert Nayereh Arjaneh from Garmsar in northern Iran began serving her ten-year prison sentence on 23 December. She and her husband were arrested at their home on 7 July 2025 after they attended a Christian seminar in Turkey with a group converts earlier in the year. Christian converts are not permitted to meet for worship in Iran or to travel to neighbouring countries to attend church services and receive teaching.

Nayereh was sentenced to a total of ten years in prison. She is in Semnan Prison, one and a half hour's drive east of her home.
