He has remained in prison ever since, incommunicado and with no release date set.. He is believed to be at the Maximum Security Criminal Interrogation Centre in Asmara Eritrea. Mussie has never been charged with any offence has never faced trial and his family have no information as to his health or exact whereabouts.
